Horticultural Section entries WILL be accepted on show day before 9 am

Judging to commence 10.30am. The Horticultural (H) Classes are judged to RHS standards.

No limit to number of entries and prize money won in each class.

Exhibits to be benched by 10.00am, remain on display until 4.30pm, can be cleared between 5.00 and 6.00pm. Produce tent to be closed to the public at 4.30pm only exhibitors will be allowed in after that time for the purpose of clearing exhibits and collecting prize money, which will be paid in the Produce tent from 4.30pm. Each exhibit must bear an entry card. Exhibitors are solely responsible for this before the tent closes for judging.

Displayed produce will be judged on freshness, appearance and overall quality. The judge reserves the right to withhold placing certificates where it is felt that the quality of produce submitted does not reach the required standard. Floral section, Vases must be provided by the Exhibitor.
